Carmen-Ainsworth Early College: The CAEC is an excellent opportunity for students from local schools looking to supplement their high school experience with more challenging, college-level courses.											
Dual Enrollment Educational Partnerships (DEEP): DEEP programs are cohort-style dual enrollment programs that range from 6-14 credit hours over an academic year. These programs are created in collaboration with a number of partnering school systems. Students must be enrolled at one of these partnering schools in order to participate in a DEEP program. Genesce Early College (GEC): The GEC is an intensive five year high school program that combines the best elements of the high school and early university experience. Students must presently be enrolled as a GEC high school student in order to dual enroll through this option.											
Grand Blanc Early College (GBEC): The GBEC is an intensive three year high school program that combines the best elements of the high school and early university experience. Students must work with their high school counselor to apply for this program.
