Turrill Principal Bob Downey, along with learning coaches Amber Weidinger and Liz Schuett, presented information on District Goal # 1 "Provide every child access to an aligned, high-quality curriculum from an early childhood to post-secondary attainment through a multi-stakeholder collaboration with business and industry, labor, and higher education to maximize

lifetime learning and success". The presentation was specifically targeted to Benchmark 1.1.B which is "80% of 3rd grade students being proficient in reading as measured by state adopted assessments". They presented details of what the teachers and other staff are doing to meet this goal.

Mr. Nolan reported on the Personnel Committee meeting that took place on August 15, 2018. Negotiating Strategies and Planning for 2018-2019, SEIU Unfair Labor Practice Update, Legal Counsel Discussion and Open Carry Update were discussed.

Mrs. Bush reported on the Finance & Operation Committee that was held on August 29, 2018. L-4029 Tax Levy, White Building Update and Open Carry Update were discussed.

Executive Curriculum Director, Michelle Bradford, along with LHS Principal, Doug Lindsay; Director of Human Resources, Kim Seifferly; Director of Special Education, Jennifer Tindall and Supervisor of School Improvement and Grant Programs, Kasie Allen, presented the revisions to the 2017-2018 Board Goals where Goal #1: Benchmark 1.1.A and 1.2.B; Goal #2: Benchmarks 2.1.A, 2.1.B and 2.1.E; and Goal #3: Benchmark 3.1.B have all been revised.

The Board approved the following items:

- Minutes from the August 1, 2018 Board Meeting.
- Board Policy 5511 STUDENTS Dress and Grooming be approved for second reading and adoption.
- A Resolution approving 2018 Tax Levy and Form L-4029.
- Approved a student readmission request with conditions.
