Board of Education Meeting Thursday, August 6, 2015

Wendy Byard reported on the Teaching, Learning, and Technology Committee meeting that was held on July 28 when the following policies were discussed: 5320 Immunization; 5460 Graduation Requirements; and 5517.01 Bullying and Other Aggressive Behaviors.

Peggy Bush reported on the Finance and Operation Committee meeting that was held on July 29 when following items were discussed: Policy 8310 Public Records; Moody Report; Athletic Complex; and Property.

The Board approved changes to the following policies for first reading: 5320 STUDENTS Immunization; 5460 STUDENTS Graduation Requirements; and 8310 OPERATIONS Public Records.

Parents Kim Mileski and Kim Hall were appointed to serve on the Lapeer County Intermediate School District's Parent Advisory Committee for three year terms.

President Mike Keller was appointed to serve as a voting delegate at the Michigan Association of School Board's Delegate Assembly being held on October 22, 2015.

Board members welcomed the year-round students back to school. They expressed condolences to Jared Field on the death of his father. The Board is pleased that the District will once again be allowing our students to get into home athletic events for free. Wendy Byard is looking for donations to pay for breakfast food for the Staff at the "Welcome Back" meeting on September 2.

Superintendent Matt Wandrie explained he is working with administrators to come up with a consistent anti-bullying curriculum to be used during iConnect and other non-instruction time. The curriculum would be different at the elementary level than secondary level. They are reviewing data by grade and by building and will look for practical steps, that can be measured, as this moves forward.

Mr. Wandrie has developed a plan to keep the Board updated on the progress of funding for the final three stages of the Athletic Complex. He is pleased that the LEADER Fund, which was created to fundraise to cover the costs for the Athletic Complex, is gaining momentum.
